Once again I would like to acknowledge, and give thanks, to all who are involved in supporting the organisations within our community. The Village Hall, Church and Scoulton Green Space, together with the members of the Parish Council, are managed by dedicated people who give generously of their time and skills. Our community needs all these dedicated people, and more, to continue to make Scoulton a good & supportive community in which to live.

Over this year the Parish Council has:

- After a long wait, seen the Village 'gates' erected.
- Has erected a bus shelter, this not without it's frustrations as it had 'one side too many' and took some time to correct.
- Has experienced some difficulty with the contractor responsible for keeping the grass cut at the Church. A new contractor, who we are confident will carry out the necessary work, has been appointed.
- Has worked together with our Parish Clerk, to make Scoulton News more informative of the work of the Council, village activities and organisations, whilst keeping costs down.
- As a community you have supported the paper, bottle and textile banks. This has raised £829.94 in the financial year just ended. This is our best ever. Thanks to all in our community who support this facility.
- Has continued to communicate with Highways on various issues within the Parish. Requested again, without success, double lines on B1108. Has draw attention to the hazardous 'kerbing' at the western end of the crematorium.
- Has organised the Annual Litter Pick

Lastly I thank our Parish Clerk, Heidi Frary, who on a personal front, has had a difficult year, but managed to continue to support us. The Parish Council appreciates greatly your work, Heidi.
